

LIBRARY BOOK OF THE MONTH

Oil Painter's Solution Book – Landscapes: Over 100 answers to your oil painting questions Author: Elizabeth Tolley Published: 2007 by North Light Books

If you are a landscape artist who uses oils, this could be a useful book for you. Here is a list of the contents to give you an idea of what this book is about:

1 – Materials; 2 – Composition & Design; 3 – Tonal Value; 4 – Colour & Light; 5 – Techniques; and, 6 – Demonstrations.



This is an easy-to-use book with ring binding which allows the book to lie flat. It assumes some users will be beginners and so covers such subjects as: what colours should I buy and what should I include in my bag for painting on location? Nevertheless, this book can also be useful for the more experienced painter with topics such as: What are the elements of design? And, how do I darken a colour? Some of the demonstrations included can be quite useful, such as: How Do I Paint Trees? Or, what can Buildings Achieve in a Landscape? The demonstrations in the last chapter include such subjects as: Summer Clouds Over Back Bay; Subtle Colour for a Foggy Morning; Focusing on Colour and Light and, Painting En Plein Air.

So, if you are thinking you might want to paint a landscape or two and feel the need for some useful information to help you on your way, or need a reminder or two about how to paint trees, this just might be the book for you.

We recently received a generous donation of books from Elly, daughter of the late Jean Finlayson who, sadly, has recently passed away. Jean played an important part in the establishment of the BAA and its continuation over the years. Our Library will be much the richer for this addition of many wonderful books.
