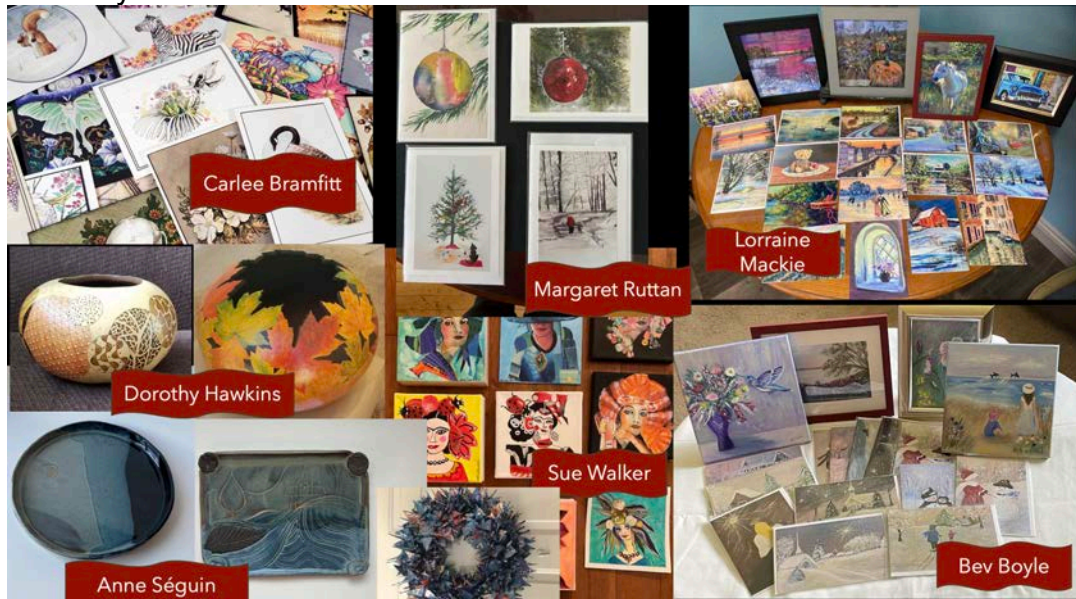

Our marketing team is doing well with Terri Horricks joining the executive and enhancing our designs and Sarah Winn leading social media and the ongoing support of many other members.

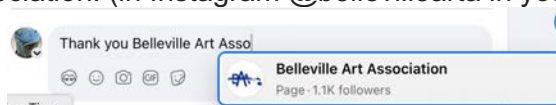
